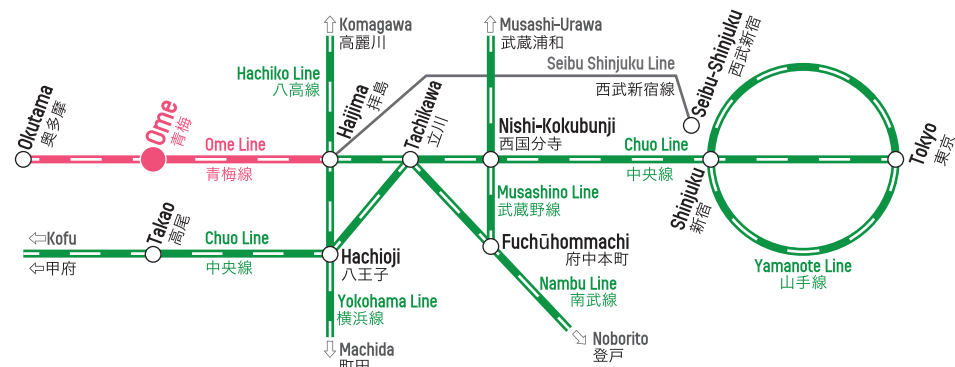
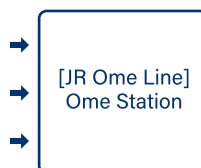

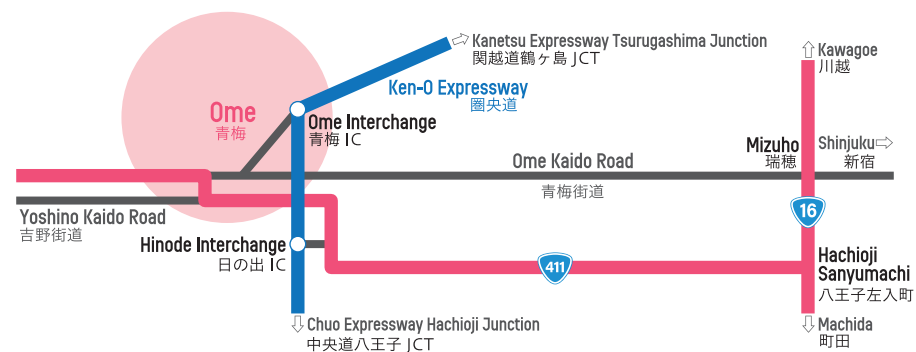

Ome Blue

### —Ome Blue is a blend of the history and tradition of Ome—

Once a textile dyed in blue, which is popular in Edo, it is the "Ome-jima stripes" woven from this area.  
 The colors of blue and textiles, stills, temples, art and food grow deeper with each dyeing...Ome is a rich natural weaving of history and culture.  
 The blue color of "Ome Blue" is the blue of the "Ome-jima stripes", the blue of the blue sky, the mountain stream, the new green leaves of early summer and the fresh produce, above all, it represents the "blue" of Ome.  
 The history, tradition and culture of the people born and raised here are woven, and a message is also being entrusted to go to Ome for now and in the future.



### Revival of the Village of Plum Blossoms

Yoshino Baigo, selected as the No.1 place in Japan for plum blossom viewing.  
 Plum blossoms are the symbol and pride of Ome.  
 In 2009, plum pox virus was detected for the first time in Japan amongst Ome's plum trees, meaning that over 30,000 trees had to be cut down, but in autumn of 2016, thanks to the valiant efforts of a large number of people, the plum trees have been replanted and the area took the first step on the road to recovery. Transforming the former "village of plum blossoms" into a new plum blossom village filled with attraction and impression...  
 The people of Ome—local citizens, groups, businesses—are working together to achieve such aim.

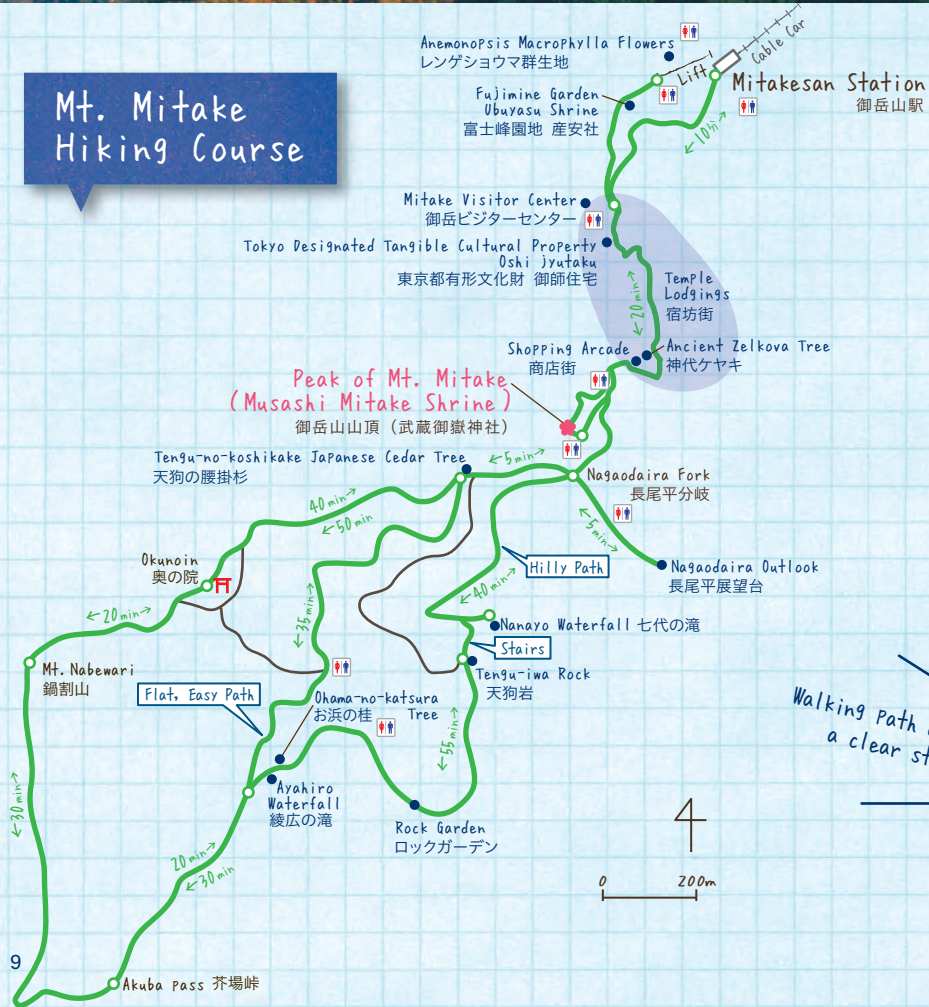
Mt. Mitake is 929m high and has been worshipped as a sacred mountain for ages. From Mitake-daira and the shine, views as far as Tokyo's skyscrapers, Tokyo Skytree, Yokohama Landmark Tower, Mt. Tsukuba and the Boso Peninsula can be enjoyed. Everyone from children to the elderly can casually enjoy walking around the mountain. The 1.5km section from Tengu-iwa Rock to Aya-hiro Waterfall is a popular hiking course known as the Rock Garden.

## Musashi Mitake Shrine

武蔵御嶽神社

Located on the peak of Mt. Mitake. It is told that Japanese monk Gyoki enshrined a statue of Zao Gongen, the main avatar of worship in the Shugendō religion, in this spot in the year 736, and the temple has flourished as a holy spot since ancient times. Influential figures and warriors alike worshipped reverently here from the Heian to Edo periods, and many number of suits of armor and swords have been presented as offerings. These precious cultural artifacts, including some national treasures, can be seen in the Treasure Hall. Since a god Ōguchi Magami (deified Japanese wolf) is called “Oinu-sama (sacred dog),” this place has long been associated with dogs, and people can be seen bringing their fuzzy friends along for a shrine visit.

## A classic Confectionery that is familiar to us both now and in the past

The Kawara-Senbei, which is the origin of the name of the Ome, and is made in the shape of plum blossoms. This is a traditional local confectionery that has been familiar for many years. Its began in the Edo period, and even now are made at several Japanese-style in the city, with each shop offering its own distinct shape and flavor.

### "Ome Senbei" a famous local specialty of Ome

During the Edo period, there were 16 confectionery shops in the villages around Ome. At that time, the farmers made and sold confectionery between the farming work. Then, in the Meiji period, someone who operates confectionery emerged as a main business.

The origin of the Ome Senbei is not known, but it is said that it was the beginning of a confectionery called the "Ichimoto" who taught others how to make the Ome Senbei.

A Man who named Tame with his brother Gon, came from Gytoku(Ichikawa City) in Chiba about 1887, they set up a shop "Ichimoto" in Ome, Besides the Ome Senbei, Manju was also well sold.

The shape of the Ome Senbei is plum blossoms on the front, and a poetry was mostly carved at the back. The poetry was written by Kobayashi Tenen who is a Japanese calligraphy of ome in Kongoji Temple. The shap of plum in the front was launched, and the remaining plum of Ome Senbei is being retained.

The Ome Senbei rice crackers is crunchy and tasty, Use with eggs, flour and sugar as the main ingredients, and it's taste like natural but rich, slightly sweet and have a nostalgic flavor. You can also enjoy various flavors such as plum shiso flavor and sesame seeds flavor.

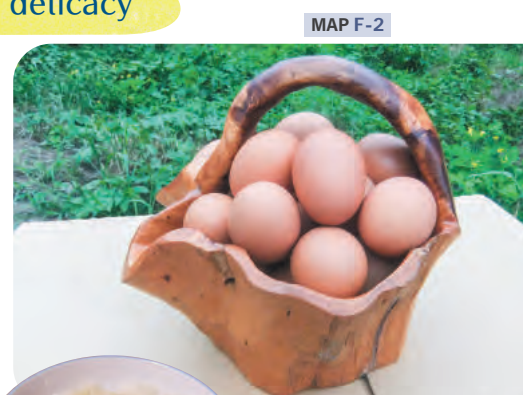

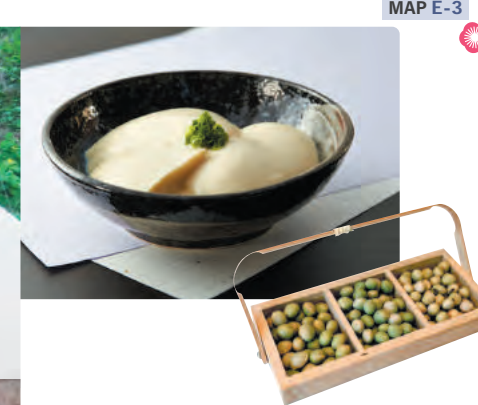
